## **SCHOOL FEES & PAYMENT SCHEDULES**

## **BOOKS**

This is the first term of a new academic year. Parents are expected to get books for their children. The prices on the market are quite serious this year. This year, our book bill features some price options:

- The cost of books for parents who would like their children supplied with the full complement of books [i.e., all textbooks, exercise books, note books and other stationery (where applicable)]
- The cost of books for parents who would like their children supplied with part of the set (i.e., all textbooks).

Please note that regardless of how your books are supplied, EVERY STUDENT MUST PAY USER BOOK FEES. This covers reference books that are used only in the school and various printed sheets for exercises. Computer Levy is also charged from Basic School to JHS.

Last year, some parents did not provide the full complement of books for their children. This makes teaching and learning very difficult. Those who had no textbooks ended up doing poorly last year. Students, especially in JHS, who do not have any of their required books will be expected to get them. Let us help the children.

## **FEEDING FEE**

The bill for feeding will be attached to this document. Please note that for lunch only, the fee is GH¢ 10.00 a day and for breakfast and lunch, the fee is GH¢ 13.00 a day. This is payable weekly, monthly or termly.

## **PARENTS' ROLE AND COMMITMENT**

Our gratitude goes out to parents who support their children in their academic work. We really appreciate you. We would ask that parents and guardians take an active role in the supervision of their children's work to ensure that their academic work is at optimum level. One way to actively do this is to attend Open Days in order to discuss your child(ren)'s academic work with their teachers. Parents are also encouraged to periodically call for their child(ren)'s books, look at their work, sign their homework, etc.

Also very important, as stated earlier, is the need for parents to follow the fee payment schedule diligently this academic year. We need your support in this regard to run the school.

## **HYGIENE PROTOCOLS AND SAFETY MEASURES**

We would like to encourage parents to do their best to ensure that their wards diligently adhere to safety and hygiene protocols. Students should mask up on account of the reported new variants of Covid-19, as well as the weather and dust. On arrival at the school every morning, all are expected to wash their hands at the hand-washing station at the gate. Kindly provide your ward with hand sanitizer.

## **EVENING SCHOOL**

Evening School is highly necessary for Junior High 2 and 3 students especially. We have some external teachers who support us with their expertise as examiners. We encourage parents to enrol their wards for Evening School. For Day students, this is at a monthly cost of GH¢ 150.00 and includes feeding fee for Supper. It runs from 5pm to 7pm.
